

LEADING A WEIRD LIFEGROUP

WHAT IS THE STUDY ABOUT?

"Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it." - Matthew 7:13-14 (NIV)

The Normal Life leads to stress, overwork, living paycheck to paycheck, lust, broken marriages, and an absence of God in our lives.

God does not call us to **NORMAL**. He calls us to be **WEIRD**.

This study will challenge us to follow Jesus and risk being Weird in a God kind of way.

HOW TO USE THE WEIRD STUDY GUIDE

Checking In: Each week (after the first session) this section will ask a couple of questions to encourage group members to think back to the lessons from the previous week. It's a great way to get started.

Video: Each week you will watch a short video teaching on the topic to be discussed. The videos are approximately 17 min. long.

Group Discussion: These are questions designed to help the group engage in conversation together. The first half of questions will reflect on the teaching from the video. The second half of questions will connect directly to a passage of scripture. The last questions will draw out personal applications.

Individual Activity: Take some time for this each week. This section is designed for your group members to personally reflect on the topic being discussed. This is to be done as an individual not as a group.

Prayer: Also take some time to pray together to close each meeting.

Between-Sessions: This is a series of study tools and exercises designed for group members to use during the week. Encourage your group members to take advantage of this. This helps people develop the habit of a regular quiet time.

WHEN TO SUB-GROUP

Sub-grouping is breaking into **SMALLER** groups within the same **LOCATION**

It's a good idea to sub-group:

- 1. When the group is large to promote greater participation.
- 2. During prayer time, so everyone has time to share.
- 3. Into gender specific groups when covering certain topics beyond the scope of your group.
- 4. Session 5 of Weird is the perfect time to subgroup by gender.

WHAT IS RIGHTNOW MEDIA

RightNow Media is an awesome, Online Streaming Video Library Resource for our Church. Think of it as Christian Netflix. It is also our video distribution channel for Weird: Because Normal Isn't Working Session Videos. Setting-up to stream RightNow to your television will provide benefits for not only this season, but future seasons as well, and it is a tremendous resource to have available for your whole family.

Abundant Life Church has partnered with RightNow to make this resource available to our entire church family.

The first step is to setup your account by following the directions in your invitation email. We can resend that email if you did not receive it. Please let us know at groups@alcpdx.com and we will send another invite.

HOW TO ACCESS RIGHTNOW MEDIA

How to Access RightNow Media

After setting up your account, you will have a login and password that you can use to access RightNow Media. The next step is establishing connectivity to your television so that you can show the videos at your Lifegroup. There are lots of ways to do this:

- 1. If you have a SmartTV, you may be able to install the RightNow App directly on your television and play from that app, similar to how a Netflix app works on SmartTVs.
- 2. Possibly the easiest way is to use a laptop with HDMI and connect directly to an open HDMI port on your TV with an HDMI cable. This will create mirroring onto the TV and whatever is displayed on your laptop will be displayed on the TV as well when you select that HDMI input on the television.
- 3. You can use a streaming media device like a Roku, AppleTV, or Chromecast to stream Rightnow. They connect to your home network wirelessly and plug directly into your television.

If you have an older television you may need to use a DVD to get the Weird: Because Normal Isn't Working study. DVDs are widely available online for purchase and we would suggest asking your Lifegroup members to each chip in a couple dollars towards the price of the DVD.

LIFEGROUPS CASE STUDIES

1. Active Listening: Communicating to someone that you hear what they are saying so they feel heard and understood.

"...everyone should be quick to listen..." - James 1:19B (NIV)

It's early in the Lifegroup season and you noticed that a couple of people in the group have opened up a little bit and shared a little bit about their personal story, but the conversation seemed to quickly move on to a new topic. You don't feel like the people who risked sharing from their lives were acknowledged or fully heard by others in the group. As the leader what are some ways that you can demonstrate and practice active listening so everyone in the Lifegroup feels like their story and input is valued and heard?

2. Asking Good Questions: There are two types of questions you should ask during your group meetings. They are questions that: Discover more information (information exchange), or explore experience (thoughts, feelings, etc.).

"The purposes of a person's heart are deep waters, but a person with understanding draws them out." - Proverbs 20:5 (NIV)

As you get into the discussion part of the Lifegroup you are feeling like the conversation is staying on the surface. People are responding to study questions with simple one word answers or simply not responding to the questions at all. What are some ways that you can encourage your Lifegroup to open up? Specifically what are some types of questions you can ask to encourage a more honest or deeper response from Lifegroup participants?

3. Giving and Receiving Feedback: This is noticing and expressing what you think, feel or perceive about someone for their benefit and awareness. This feedback can be either positive or negative.

"It's better to heed a wise man's rebuke than listen to the song of fools."

- Ecclesiastes 7:5 (NIV)

Anytime a group of people gather together conflict is inevitable. As you get into the Lifegroup season you are feeling that one of the group members is being disruptive when other people are sharing. He/she is interrupting or talking over people in the group. What are some ways that you can approach this group member in order to give feedback?

On the flip side a person in the Lifegroup approaches you to offer you feedback or criticisms on how you lead the group. He/she feels like you are not valuing the input and sharing of group members during the discussion time. How can you respond to this feedback in a positive way?

SCHEDULE FOR THE WEIRD SEASON

Don't underestimate the importance of starting the season with an Intro and Welcome Week. Don't rush into the study! Use the first week of your Lifegroup season to:

- Get to know each other or reconnect with each other
- Get to know anyone who is new to your Lifegroup
- Discuss key dates for the season
- Review the Lifegroup Participant Covenant together
- Delegate! Assign group responsibilities and create Lifegroup Coordinators

FALL LIFEGROUP SERVE PROJECTS

GLOBAL SERVE PROJECT: SUITCASES FOR UGANDA

The orphans we sponsor in Uganda have a tremendous opportunity to attend school. These children have very little and their belongings can all fit into one suitcase. However, most often they don't even have this. One piece of hard-sided luggage would be incredibly helpful to these students for storage and transportation. It would be used as a "dresser" of sorts. Donations will be shipped with previous clothing donations on December 1st. Ask your Lifegroup leader for details about being a part of this project.

LOCAL SERVE PROJECT: ANGEL TREE

Angel Tree Ministries reaches out to the children of those in prison and their families with the love of Christ. With the permission of the inmate, Angel Tree gathers the names and addresses of the children and distributes them to local churches. This year our Lifegroups will have the opportunity to participate in this outreach. Participating groups will receive the names of inmates' children in our area and will purchase, wrap, and deliver a Christmas gift for each child on behalf of their parent. Talk with your Lifegroup leader about your group participating in Angel Tree this year. More information will be coming in October.

LIFEGROUP LEADER EXPECTATIONS

What am I supposed to do as a leader anyway?

Before Sign-ups Begin:

- Organize the basic Lifegroup details (think who, what, where, why)
- Register the Lifegroup online at alcpdx.com/startgroup
 This gives the Lifegroups team all the details for listing in the catalog

Sign-ups (about 3 weeks):

- Invite people to your Lifegroup
- Follow-up with all sign-ups by phone and e-mail within 24 hours
- Plan the first meeting and a season schedule
- Begin contact with your Support Team Member
- Don't lead alone secure a coordinator(s) for your Lifegroup
- Send a reminder e-mail out the week before your Lifegroup meets

In Session (about 8-12 weeks):

- Facilitate regular Lifegroup meetings
- Be prepared. You don't have to know everything, just stay one step ahead
- Send weekly prayer request e-mails and meeting reminder e-mails to the Lifegroup
- Make sure to faithfully lead your Lifegroup to SERVE and PLAY during the season
- Identify potential leaders within my Lifegroup and give them opportunities to step up and coordinate parts of the Lifegroup
- Take attendance for your Lifegroup in Groups Manager
- Communicate off-ramps. Let your people know it's okay to switch groups
- Stay in contact with your Support Team Member
- Start planning for next season

At Rest:

- Communicate the plan for next season by letting my Support Team Member know
- Let my Support Team Member know who in my group is preparing to lead next season
- Share a story from my Lifegroup's season at alcpdx.com/mystory

LIFEGROUP LEADER COVENANT (REFERENCE ONLY)

As an Abundant Life Church Lifegroup leader, I commit to the following:

- 1. I am an active member of Abundant Life Church and living out the membership covenant. If not yet a member, I will attend the next available membership class.

BAPTISM AT ABUNDANT LIFE

Wednesday, November 19th - Worship Night

1. What is Baptism?

Baptism is the next step in your spiritual growth if you have made the decision to follow Jesus and make Him the Lord and Savior of your life. Baptism is an outward expression of your inward commitment to follow Jesus Christ. The decision to get baptized is out of obedience to Jesus and publicly illustrates that identity with Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection. It also publicly illustrates to your church family that you are a follower of Jesus.

2. Who Should Be Baptized?

Every person who believes in Jesus Christ as the Lord and Savior of their life. Baptism is your public testimony that you are a follower of Jesus.

3. When Should I Be Baptized?

As soon as you believe and put your faith in Jesus as the Lord and Savior of your life you can and should be baptized. There is no reason to delay. If you wait until you are "perfect", you will never feel "good enough!"

4. How Should I Be Baptized?

The Greek word for "baptize" literally means to immerse or dip under the water. And every baptism in the bible, including Jesus', involved being fully immersed under the water. The picture of someone being fully immersed under the water best symbolizes the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. For these reasons we practice baptizing people by fully immersing them under the water at Abundant Life.

5. What do I Wear?

You can come prepared by wearing swim trunks, shorts, or whatever clothes you don't mind getting wet in. You can also simply wear the clothes you came to church in. You will get a towel to dry off with and a dry T-shirt to wear home. There are bathrooms to change in if you bring a change of clothes.

6. Can I Invite Family and Friends?

Absolutely! We love to have them share the significance of this special day with you! In fact, family and friends are invited to come up around the baptismal to support you as you are baptized.

MEMBERSHIP AT ABUNDANT LIFE

1. What is Membership?

Membership is when you make the commitment to become part of a spiritual family. You receive care and encouragement from other members and are able to offer it to others as well. You also become a ministry partner in the mission and vision of the church. You then have a place to serve and give, using the gifts that God has given you. The difference between a member and attender is one word: COMMITMENT!

2. Who Should Become a Member?

If you have been attending Abundant Life and would consider this your church home, then attending Membership Class is a good idea. You will be given an "insiders look" at the church and have the opportunity to join Abundant Life Church as a member. Membership is required to lead a lifegroup at Abundant Life Church

3. Who Teaches the Membership Class?

The class is taught by the pastors at Abundant Life.

4. Does Attending the Membership Class make me a Member?

No, you will be given an opportunity at the end of the class to sign the Membership Covenant if you believe that Abundant Life is the church God is leading you to join. We ask that Members at Abundant Life have expressed faith in Jesus as the Lord and Savior of their life, have been baptized by immersion, and have completed the Membership Class and signed the Membership Covenant.
